New Changes

As of the 1 July 2009 the revised *Building Fire Safety Regulation 2008* will require that 'high occupancy buildings' appoint a Fire Safety Adviser. High occupancy buildings are defined as:

- ◆ workplaces where there are 30 or more employees.
- ◆ Class 2 or 3 buildings that are more than 25 metres in height.
- ◆ Licensed premises or class 4 that have been identified by the Commissioner.

Competency Units

This course consists of the following Units of Competency. To achieve the title of "Fire Safety Adviser", students must complete all 8 Units of Competency.

PUAWER001A	Identify, prevent and report potential workplace emergency situations
PUAWER002A	Ensure workplace emergency procedures, systems and processes are implemented
PUAWER003A	Manage and monitor workplace emergency procedures, equipment and other resources
PUAWER004A	Respond to workplace emergencies
PUAWER005A	Operate as part of an emergency control organisation
PUAWER006A	Lead an emergency control organisation
PUAWER007A	Manage an emergency control organisation
PUAWER008A	Confine small workplace emergencies

Content

- ◆ Interpret legislation that impacts upon building fire safety in Queensland
- ◆ Identify the roles and responsibilities of a Fire Safety Adviser
- ◆ Demonstrated understanding of the risk management process
- ◆ Identify functions of prescribed fire safety installations and emergency equipment within buildings and the respective maintenance and recording requirements
- ◆ Demonstrated knowledge of the emergency control organisation (AS3745) role and functions
- ◆ Lead an emergency control team and perform the role of evacuation coordinator
- ◆ Develop and conduct a fire safety risk assessment and compliance report
- ◆ Conduct and evaluate report of evacuation exercise/drill
- ◆ Demonstrated ability to identify, select and operate portable fire fighting equipment
